

# Re-accrediting for Competition Coaches

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Coaching is the backbone of our sport. Your work as a Competition Coach is important in developing athletes along the Athlete Pathway, as well as supporting the development of coaches and members within your club. **Thank -you for your commitment to coaching.**

In order to maintain a consistent approach to coaching and ensure that coaches maintain a minimum standard in their coaching skills, it is necessary for all Coaches to update every four years. This is a simple process, and also helps to keep our records up to date.

## Process for Updating

### 1. Coaching Assessment

Using the “Competition Coach Reaccreditation Form” (which is available from the AISL Website or from your State or National Coaching Director), your coaching skills are observed and assessed by either another Competition Coach (who has completed Assessor Training), or by an Advanced Coach.

A list of Coaches who are able to conduct Assessments is available from your State or National Coaching Director. It is also possible to ask a Coach from another Shooting Discipline to do the assessment with you (especially if they are located closer to you) – ask your State or National Coaching Director for more information.

### 2. AISL Coaches Code of Conduct

You need to read the AISL Coaches Code of Conduct, and sign the Agreement Form – both of these forms are available from the AISL website or from your National Coaching Director.

### 3. Financial Member

It is a requirement that you are a financial member of your Association. If you have a change of address, email or phone number, you should also include this.

When you have this material, send it to your National Coaching Director (or the appropriate person in your Association). It will then be forwarded to the AISL office, where it will be updated on the Sports Accreditation Online (SAO) system, and a new Club Coach Card will be printed and sent to you.
